

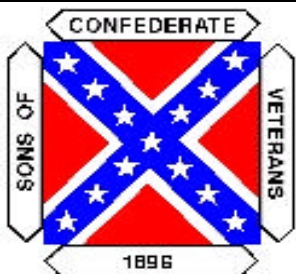

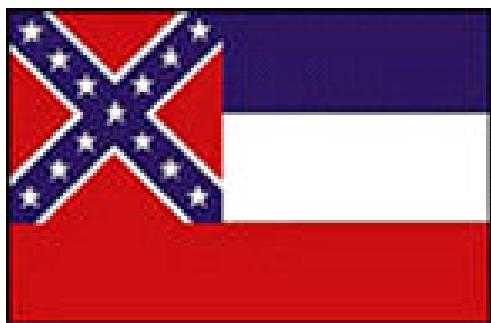
Commander Randy Rogers reports that the program for July will be presented by Justice William Waller, Jr.

June Meeting Report

Robert Murphree: The Real Rebel Yell



Compatriot Robert Murphree returned to the speaker duties to present a brief program on the “real” Rebel Yell, which is not the “yee-haw” yell typically heard given by reenactors today. Instead the yell is of a rather high pitch which, under certain acoustic conditions could sound almost like an unearthly scream or even a yodel. After hearing the recorded example provided by Compatriot Murphree, one can easily see that the massed voices of several hundred to several thousand attacking Confederates could strike fear in the heart of all but seasoned Yankee vets. (It’s uncertain what Robert was saying when this picture was taken; he may have been describing the size of tomatoes from his garden.)

Commander Emmett Eaton turned the reins over to our new camp commander Randy Rogers, who conducted the bulk of the day’s business. Randy did an excellent job as 1st Lt. Commander so he’s a natural for moving up to Com-

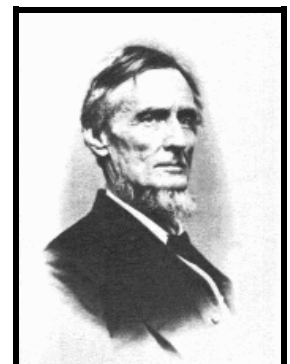

Chaplain's Dispatch

Dear Friends and Compatriots:

This is being written in early July as our Nation once again celebrates our founding as an independent nation on July 4, 1776, some 233 years ago. For many, July 4th is simply another holiday that has no particular meaning. For others it is a time to reflect upon that great document of American freedom. Although the document written by Thomas Jefferson is referred to as the "Declaration of Independence", the document signed by 56 delegates to the Continental Congress was entitled "In Congress, July 4, 1776, The unanimous Declaration of the thirteen united States of America."

The first paragraph follows:

"When in the Course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the Powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation."

The charges against the King of England were next set forth.

The final paragraph follows:

"We, therefore, the Representatives of the united States of America, in General Congress, Assembled, appealing to the Supreme Judge of the world for the rectitude of our intentions, do, in the Name, and by the Authority of the good People of these Colonies, solemnly publish and declare, That these United Colonies are, and of Right ought to be Free and Independent States; that they are Absolved from all allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political connection between them and the State of Great Britain, is and ought to be totally dissolved; and that as Free and Independent States, they have full Power to levy War, conclude Peace, contract Alliances, establish Commerce, and to do all other Acts and Things which Independent States may of right do. And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the Protection of Divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor."

The signers of that Document knew that the penalty for their actions was death by hanging. Thank God for our Founding Fathers!

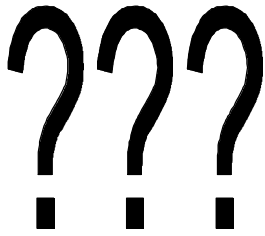

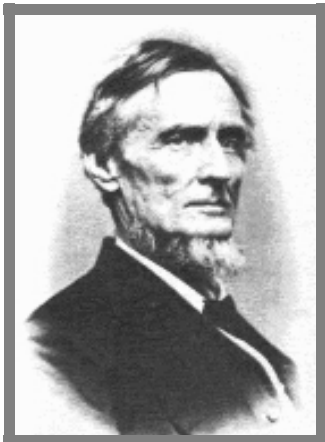
